

Noun

Nouns are people, places or things. They tell us who, what or where.

Examples:

- The children arrived at school.
- The boat filled with water and sank.
- I would like to be a doctor when I grow up.
- Please would you pass me the pencil.
- There is a hedgehog in the bushes.



Proper Noun

Proper nouns are specific people, places or things. They always start with a capital letter.

Examples:

- Achiever Ace is little and blue.
- Foxhills Infant School is in Ashurst.
- My birthday is in January.
- What are you doing on Saturday?
- Mrs Howe is our head teacher



Pronoun

Pronouns take the place of a noun. We can use these instead of nouns.

Examples:

- We love school!
- He is such a sweet baby.
- They went swimming in the sea.
- I am feeling very hungry.
- Would you like a drink?



Verb

Verbs are actions or doing words. Verbs tell us what is being done.

Examples:

- He ran across the playground as quickly as he could.
- Carefully, she painted a picture for her teacher.
- They are laughing very loudly.
- Let's go to the shop.
- I thought carefully about how to solve the problem.



Adjective

Adjectives describe a noun and tell us more information about it.

Examples:

- The cake was delicious!
- The giant was tall and fierce.
- The girl gently stroked the adorable, little kitten.
- In the sky, the beautiful rainbow is peeking out from behind the fluffy clouds.



Adverb

Adverbs describe a verb. They tell you more about the verb and they often end in _ly.

Examples:

- The dancer moved gracefully.
- · Loudly, the children cheered.
- The teacher softly spoke to the class.
- Rapidly, the terrified mouse ran away from the large cat.



Conjunctions

Conjunctions are used to join clauses together.

Examples of coordinating conjunctions (compound sentences):

- The kitten was playing and the lazy dog was sleeping by the roaring fire.
- I wanted to buy a banana but they only had apples.
- We could go to the park or we could play games in the sunny garden.
- It is a lovely day $s\sigma$ we are going to play games on the field.

Examples of subordinating conjunctions (complex sentences):

- The little mouse curled up under a tree, when the sky began to grow dark.
- During the night the hedgehog was awake because hedgehogs are nocturnal.
- If you eat your vegetables, you can have a cupcake.
- The children were excited that they were going up on the nature trail.
