Year R - Autumn Animal Adventures

This half term, our Year R pupils have got hands on during our welly walks and have been learning all about the world around us, including our local wildlife, seasonal changes and aspects of our school environment.

We met Percy the Park Keeper on our first welly walk of the half term and explored the text 'After the storm' thinking about the habitats and lives of animals. We have since been further exploring colour mixing, relating to the colours we have seen around us, using paints and natural resources to mark make. We have further developed our emotional literacy skills, thinking

about independence and how we are feeling throughout our school day, introducing our mood monsters to our classrooms.

We have continued to refine our gross motor development in both PE and during our continuous provision, accessing bikes and assault courses on a regular basis. In expressive arts and design we have enjoyed junk modelling and using a range of tools including scissors, tape and hole punches.

We have really enjoyed our Christmas performance this year and are proud of how much we have achieved! Well done

Year 1 - Whatever the Weather!

This half term started with a video call from Jim, a weatherman who had never lived in the UK before. He asked the children to find out everything about the weather and write him a weather report.

In geography and science, the children have learnt all about the different seasons of the year, what happens in each season and what the weather is like in each one.

In writing we have been thinking about using adjectives in our writing to make it more exciting. We listened to the story 'Lila and the Secret of the Rain' using it for different pieces of writing such as diary entries. To end this half term the children wrote their own stories similar to 'The Snowman' using all their lovely adjectives and sentence boundaries to make their stories interesting.

In maths, the children have done some amazing addition and subtraction work. The children have been using part whole models and fact families to find the two subtraction and two addition number sentences to practise the concept of inverse.

The children have had a lot of fun this half term using paint in art to create a winter scene inspired by the artist Alma Thomas. The children loved mixing paint colours and using different sized brushes to create different effects.

The children loved our Big Mouth theatre workshop and all had lots of fun joining in making freeze frames. Then to finish the term

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the children performed their wonderful Christmas play and were all amazing in their roles. We are really proud of them. Well done year 1!





Year 2 - To the Rescue!



To launch our learning for this half term, the Year Two children thoroughly enjoyed superhero day, during which they learned about real life superheroes. This inspired them to begin their exciting topic, 'To the Rescue!'

In history lessons, the children learned about the lives of two significant individuals (Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole) and they used their new knowledge to make comparisons between healthcare and society in the 1800s and today.

In geography, the children revisited their fieldwork skills from Year One and developed further their knowledge of the local area by deciding where the best place would be to build a new hospital in Ashurst.

In science, the children started their materials learning journey. After revisiting the properties of materials that they learned about in Year One, they conducted an experiment to test how solid

objects made from certain materials can be changed by; squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. They thoroughly enjoyed this experiment!

In reading this half term the children explored the concept of reading for pleasure. They practised sequencing and retelling narratives and practised using non-fiction books that were structured in different ways. They particularly enjoyed our lead text Vlad and the Florence Nightingale Adventure and after learning about coordination and subordination throughout their writing learning journey, they were able to apply their new knowledge and skills to write their own story, Vlad and the Mary Seacole Adventure.

In maths this half term, Year Two have used their developing number knowledge to learn more efficient strategies for addition and subtraction. They have enjoyed solving numberless problems in different ways!

In art this half term the concept was printing and the children printed their own wrapping paper to sell at the Winter Fayre. In DT they built upon their knowledge of mechanisms (levers and sliders) and used this to create their own card with a mechanism.

In computing, the children learned about how computers can be used to create posters and learned how to add pictures, change the colour, size and font. In RE this half term, the children learned about how a candle can be used as a symbol.

In PE Year Two developed their understanding of the social cog as they practised praising, encouraging and showing support for others, through the context of dynamic balance.

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












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
